Dear Friends,

Can you believe that the new year is just 10 days away?

"What? 10 days, Todd—come'on!—you know January 1 is NOT 10 days away! What's going on?"

What's going on is the Christian calendar year, friends; the new year begins on Sunday, November 28th, the Sunday we enter into Advent. Sunday, November 28th is just another Sunday on the Julian calendar that the world uses.

What is Advent "about?" The term "advent" is adopted from Latin *adventus* meaning "coming; arrival", translated from the original Greek word *parousia*. In the New Testament, *parousia* is the term used for the Second Coming of Christ. Thus, the season of Advent in the Christian calendar anticipates the "coming of Christ" from three different perspectives: the physical nativity in Bethlehem, the reception of Christ in the heart of the believer, and the eschatological Second Coming.

How do we "anticipate" all of this? Many people keep an Advent calendar in their homes, or make use of an Advent devotional. Most church families make use of an Advent wreath with candles that are lit each of the four Sundays that occur during this season. For many, a "hanging of the greens" event is another way to mark the start of Advent, as well as the placement of a Christmas tree in the home or sanctuary. And, of course, there are the other decorations we put in our homes or businesses.

What are some of the ways you prepare for the arrival of Jesus Christ?

Beginning Sunday November 28th, I invite you to join me for a series of four Adult Education classes that will focus upon this period of waiting.

- Have you ever heard of a Jesse Tree? Well, we will discover—or re-discover—an age-old Advent activity on November 28th!
- Enjoy Christmas carols? Well, I think we all have our favorite song—or two—or 20! But did you know that one Christmas carol once served as a subversive, underground catechism? Curious about which one? Come on Sunday, December 5th, to find out (and, yes sing it!).
- What can you say about Handel's Messiah? I think all of us would agree that it is one of the great treasures of the season, for we often hear it sung during this time of year. On Sunday, December 12th, we will see how this masterwork came to be and how, down the years, it has come to be envisioned—and performed--very differently.
- And, finally, on December 19th—on the Sunday where we remember the visit of the angel Gabriel to Mary--we will look at how this moment in time, The Annunciation, has inspired artists down the years to portray this moment of great joy—and no little mystery.

We will meet in the Worship and Music Room, Room 206, beginning at 9:45 a.m., each Sunday. Our time together will feature Powerpoint images, as well as musical excerpts heard in high quality sound!

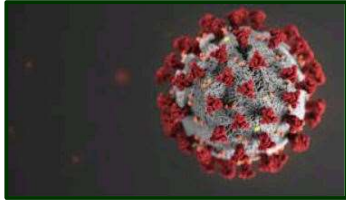
