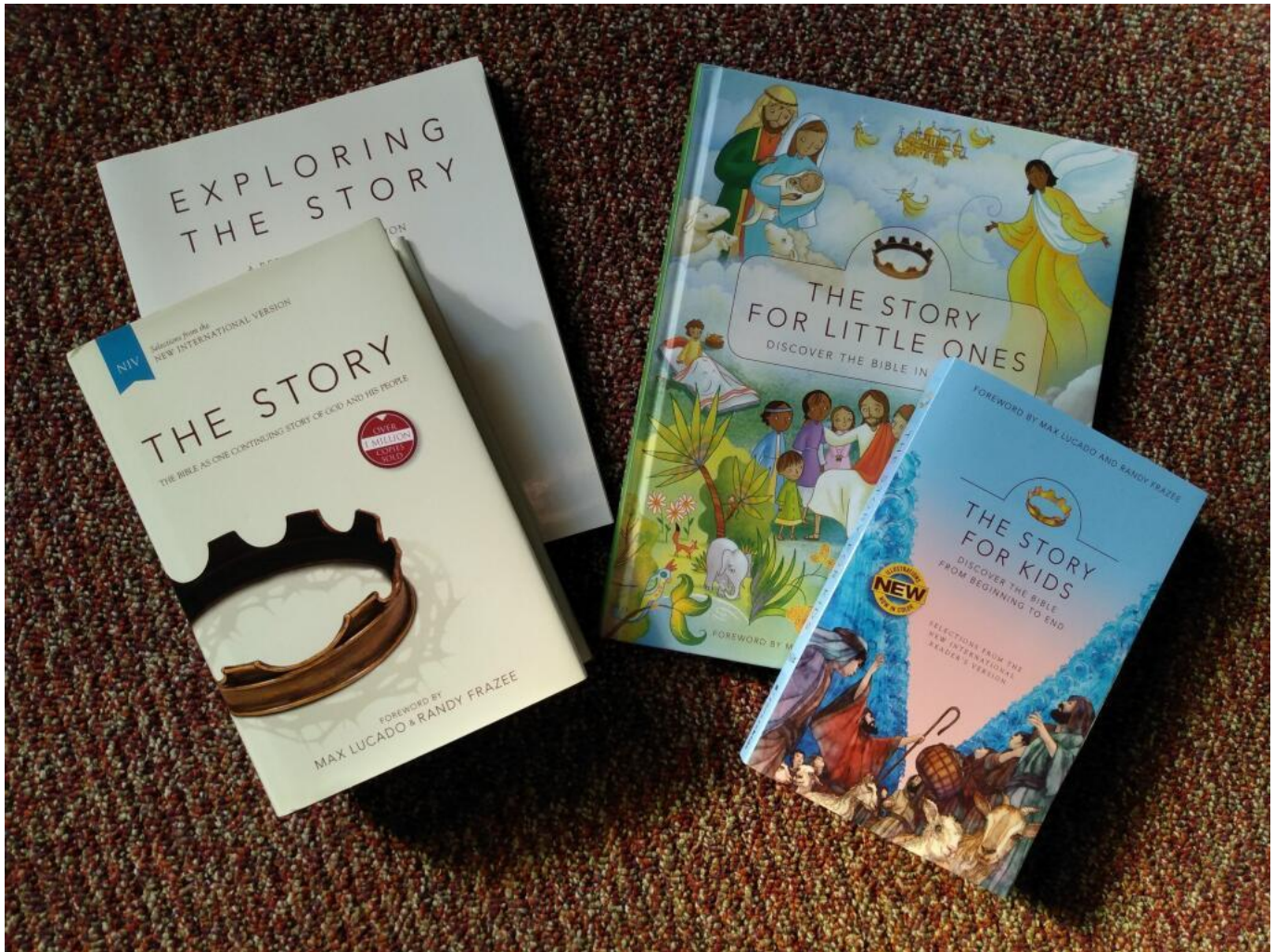

“Your Story—My Story--and God’s Story”

Dear Friends,

Imagine yourself as an actor—or actress—in a play. You have everything you need: You have a part—you have a place on the stage—you even have a costume that fits! But you don’t have an understanding of the story. You have not read the script. You have no idea how the story began, or where it is headed. You only find yourself on the stage.

*Wouldn’t it be great to have the script?
Wouldn’t be great to know how the drama begins?
To know how it will end?*

The Bible is God's script. It tells us how things began, and where history is headed. Sometimes, however, it is difficult to see how this script "hangs together"--to sense the plot behind all the various stories and people we meet through the 66 books that make up our Bible.

The purpose of "The Story" is to help us better understand God's script. It does this by arranging excerpts from the NIV English translation of Scripture in chronological order. Since we are linear thinkers, this approach works well: You and I can see God's eternal plan unfolding in human history. We can also see how God enlists human beings, in their everyday lives, to advance God's great plan for humanity.

Wouldn't it be great to know your part in God's great play?

I hope you will want to learn about your part in God's great play, and will want to do along with fellow members and friends here, at Park! We will begin a church-wide study of "The Story" beginning on Sunday, September 11th. Over a period of 29 weeks, we will cover the 31 chapters found in "The Story", not just in our Adult and Children's Sunday School classes—but also in our time together in Sunday worship. A complete schedule of weekly chapters we will read—with the events, people, and theme found in them—follows this invitation.

New and used copies of "The Story" can be found from a variety of vendors, but I hope you will want to purchase a new copy through Park Church. We have secured a wonderful bulk rate price of just \$5 per copy (as opposed to the list price of \$20). We have also secured copies of a wonderful companion book to "The Story." It is called "Exploring the Story: A Reference Companion." This book outlines the characters you encounter in each chapter of "The Story", provides an overview of the happens in each chapter, the main points of the chapter, as well as provides helpful maps and color photos. We have secured good quality used copies of this guide (normally priced \$20) which can also be purchased at a price of just \$5.

I look forward to joining YOU, as we discover OUR part in God's story!

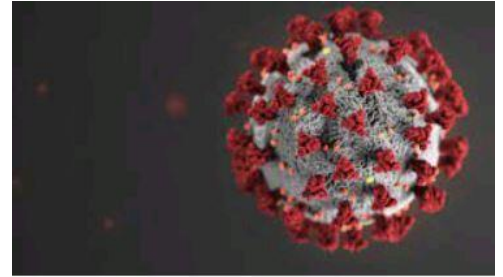

The Committee for Membership Involvement will be doing a luncheon outside in the pavilion (weather permitting) for everyone on September 4th right after worship. This will be a "Thanks for Summer" luncheon. Our committee will be providing everything. Just bring a lawn chair.

The Evolution of the Food Pantry

The Mission Commission started the food pantry in 2020 because of the Covid 19 pandemic. It operated in the picnic shelter 24/7. Plastic tarps were used around the perimeter of the shelter to keep weather out. Volunteers shop 6 days a week to keep the pantry stocked. Plastic covered bins were labeled for various foods and cleaning products. Labels were made for bread, cereal, canned vegetables, canned fruits, pastas, sauce, boxed dinners, hygiene products, diapers, baby food, cat and dog food, and juices. Church members were extraordinary supporters of the program, many hands and very generous financial support. God's people were in need and his church stepped up. Praise God!

As we moved through the pandemic the Mission Commission decided to pack boxes in the church basement and distribute them weekly in the parking lot. We advertised in the surrounding communities that boxes of food would be passed out on certain days at designated times. Once again volunteers shopped and packed the boxes to pass out. They averaged 6 to 12 boxes each event to folks in need of assistance. On the designated days volunteers carried the food boxes upstairs to the parking lot entrance by the church office to pass out as cars drove up to the entrance. Although this was a large task our volunteers continued helping people in need of food assistance. The need to supplement people with food has continued to increase as the war in Ukraine is affecting the economy worldwide and the slow recovery from the Covid 19 pandemic has also disrupted the world economy. These major factors lead the Mission Commission to looking into expanding and improving our efforts to supplement those who need help. We first talked about other churches we could come together with and increase our effectiveness but didn't find anything in the area. Our office assistant Bre mentioned one day that the Salvation Army in Rochester operated a food pantry. She put us in contact with her friends that are the Envoys in Rochester, Chris and Mary Kay Mackneer. We went to see their food pantry and talked about partnering with them at the pantry, they were very receptive to the idea. We talked about how we could assist along with financial support.

They have a need for people to assist shoppers when they come in on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 9 AM to 12 PM. This involves reaching the top shelves if they need assistance explain the number of different items that can be taken per visit. Some older folks need help with the grocery cart. Seniors get a box made up just for seniors once a month and can also shop from the pantry. Volunteers are most welcome and needed, so contact the office or a member of the Mission Commission if you are interested in helping. We continue to ask for financial contributions to the commission for the food pantry.

Beaver Yard Sale

While 2023 is months away, there are two events that we would like you to be aware of. The first is the annual Beaver Yard Sale usually held the first Saturday of May. The church is planning on participating with hopefully several tables of items for sale and maybe even an overflow into other areas like the pavilion. So, start gathering items and small furniture (that one person can carry) to donate to the church. You will be able to bring your items to the church beginning in March 2023. The second is a bazaar/craft fair to be held either September 30th, October 7th, or 14th, 2023. This will be held in Guild Hall. We are still working out all the details for the event but wanted all the crafters in the church to know about this and start crafting away.
