Dear Friends,

Well, spring has really sprung in Beaver! Each morning sees rising temperatures, as well as more and more green enfolding the landscape.

This same time of year also means weeds...lots of weeds!

If you are like me, the above picture illustrates a reality we are all facing, just now, as we look at our lawns and gardens.

Many years ago, the Apostle Paul spoke to a reality in our world today: The fact of evil. In keeping with the teachings of Jesus, as well as the gospel writers, Paul spoke to evil as a strong and persistent force in our world, a force that intrudes upon—even disfigures—the good world God has made.

What is to be done?

To my mind, the fact of weeds—the fact of evil in the world, if you like—can sometimes distract us from the need to fertilize the grass. As just about any lawn care professional will tell you, one way to combat weeds is to "crowd them out" by growing denser grass around them. This limits the weed's ability to get light and water, even to propagate themselves. And so—just last week—I put down my spring application of Scott's Turf Builder with Weed Control because, well, the above photo is pretty much what my lawn looks like, just now!

Of course, all this is to say that we need to do all we can to get good things to grow in our world.

How do we do this?

To my mind, Paul speaks to this task in a most helpful way in his letter to the Romans: "Do not be overcome by evil, but overcome evil with good." Romans 12:21 NIV

I am drawn to this passage because it centers around having what is good "crowd out the bad"—like the grass in my lawn is beginning to do to the weeds just now. Elsewhere in the gospels, our Lord speaks to letting God be the final judge of those who pursue evil. What a challenge this is! I am pretty sure I know what is grass and what is weeds--in my lawn! Our Lord, knowing my tendency to get things wrong commands patience in the lawn that is our world. It is not to me—or to us—to do the judging. What is left to me—and to you—is do what is good and honorable—what is just and true—in our daily lives.

And so, as you join me in battling unwanted weeds in your lawn or garden just now, take a few moments to see where you can continue to do good—or can begin to do some good. Make a start—and keep at it!

As you do this, rest assured that you will grow in goodness and grace, for our Lord is the Master Gardener. You will not lack for the fertilizer you need!
